Community Ministry

- ◆ **Outreach Team** - Leads Shiloh UMC in addressing the concerns and conditions of people in our own community and across the world through evangelism, missions and visitation
- ◆ **Vacation Bible School** - Help with the five day program during the summer for children 3 years old through Junior High.
- ◆ **Fall Festival** - Help with the annual Fall Festival held on October 31. Volunteers are needed in many different areas, painting, assembling games, collecting candy & prizes, cooking, working games and much much more!
- ◆ **Sewing To Serve** - Those who knit, sew, and create in the name of Christ to show compassion and a witness to others.
- ◆ **Food Bank** - People from Shiloh help serve and work at the local food bank as a witness and support for those in need of basic supplies and food.
- ◆ **Operation Christmas Child Shoe Boxes** - A ministry of Franklin Graham, every Advent season the people of Shiloh wrap fill, and donate thousands of shoe boxes to those in many countries who would otherwise not know of Christmas.

Evangelism/Witnessing

- ◆ **Evangelism Team** - Reaching out and sharing the gospel is a directive for all followers of Christ. Those on this team help direct and organize the entire church to share faith.
- ◆ **Search for the Christ Child** - Volunteers are needed in many different areas: acting, shepherding, preparing snacks, set-up/tear down, advertising, ticket sales and more!

- ◆ **Branchville Prison Ministry** - Those called to live out Christ's command of reaching out to those who are incarcerated.
- ◆ **Muffin Ministry** - On a rotating basis people bring refreshments, help prepare drinks and set up the refreshment table.
- ◆ **New Comer Visitation** - As a part of our evangelism ministry we visit those who come to Shiloh to worship.
- ◆ **Church Sign Ministry** - Those who keep an updated weekly message on our church sign for passersby to read.
- ◆ **Lay Speaking Ministry** - A lay speaker (local church or certified) is a member who is eager to serve the Church with their ability to communicate. They are available to conduct, or assist in conducting, worship and present sermons and addresses when requested by the pastor, district superintendent, or committee on lay speaking. Speaker training courses are required and provided.
